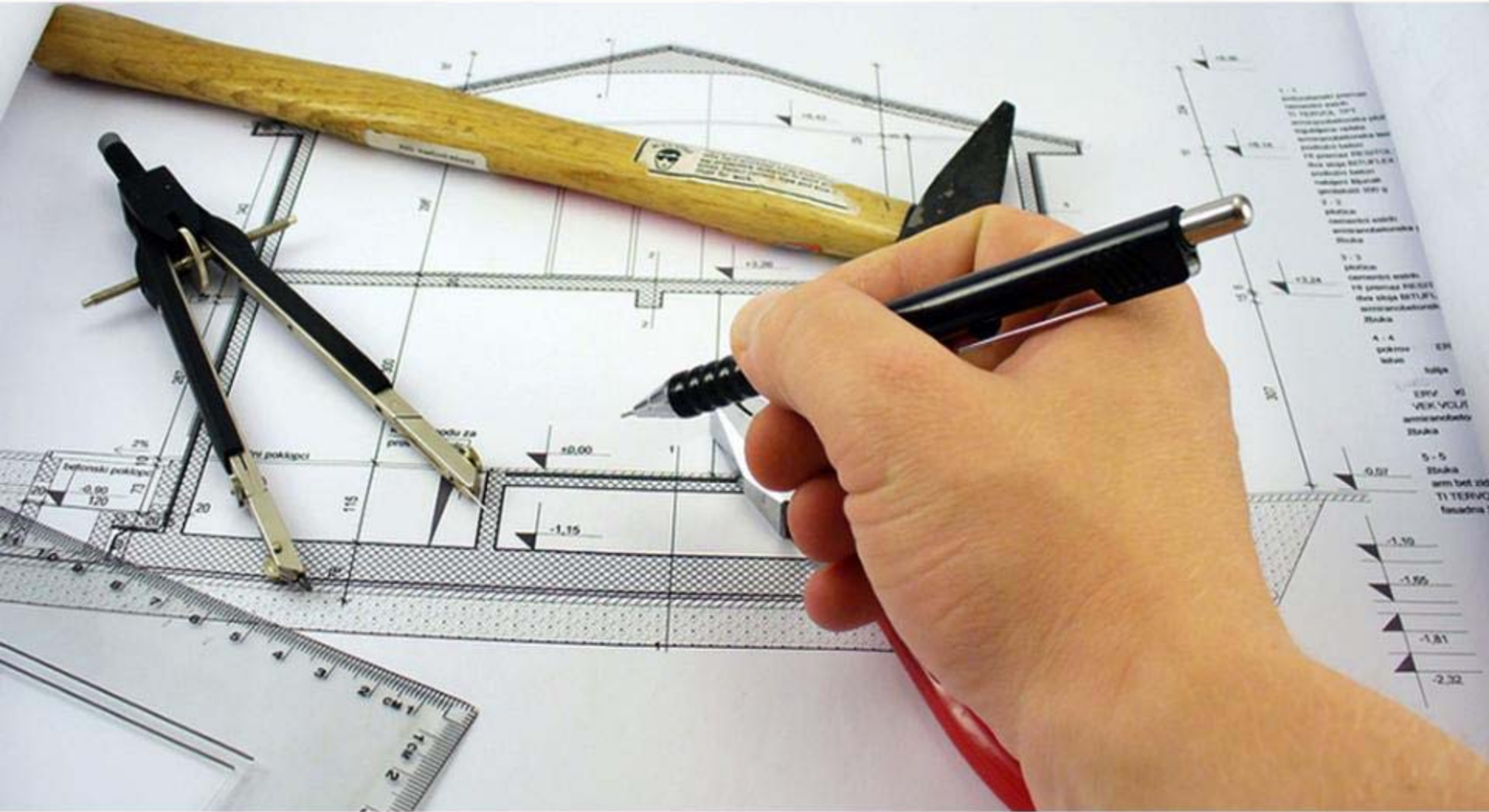


# Pine-Richland High School

# Project Need

- HS Expansion Committee
  - Convened by Dr. Manley and Dr. Rondinelli
  - October 29, 2007
  - Over 40 community members including staff and administration
- The Committee reviewed
  - Demographics
  - The impact of growth on the capacity of the HS



# Considerations

## Activities

- Include areas for student activities, collaboration, and tutoring
- Preserve field space
- Consider a larger gymnasium
- Evaluate pool and auditorium expansion

## Academics

- Preserve 9-12 grade configuration
- Structure small learning environments
- Expand music & art areas
- Increase science labs
- Build a 21<sup>st</sup> Century learning environment

## Administrative

- Economize space
- Expand central administration
- Emphasize safety and security
- Construct a more pedestrian friendly bus loop

# HS Building and Addition

- The current high school was dedicated in 1993 to accommodate 750 students.
- The high school was expanded and rededicated in 2000 to hold 1,500 students.
- On the third day of school in 2009, we had 1,469 students enrolled. The building has exceeded its functional capacity.



# Special Board Meeting

- On October 13, 2008, the PRSD School Board convened a special meeting to discuss the crowded conditions at the high school.
- Dr. Rondinelli reviewed current and projected enrollment.
- The HS administration reviewed critical needs.
- A priority list was established.

# Critical Needs

- Lockers
- Classrooms
- Cafeteria space
- Hallways are crowded.
- Safety concerns & front door security
- Additional parking
- Revised traffic pattern and better location for buses at dismissal



# Priority List

- **First Priorities**
  - Build additional classrooms
  - Build additional cafeteria seating
  - Build or renovate e-learning or video conferencing areas
  - Design an area for student activities, tutoring and student collaboration
  - Construct a new bus loading/unloading area
  - Purchase land





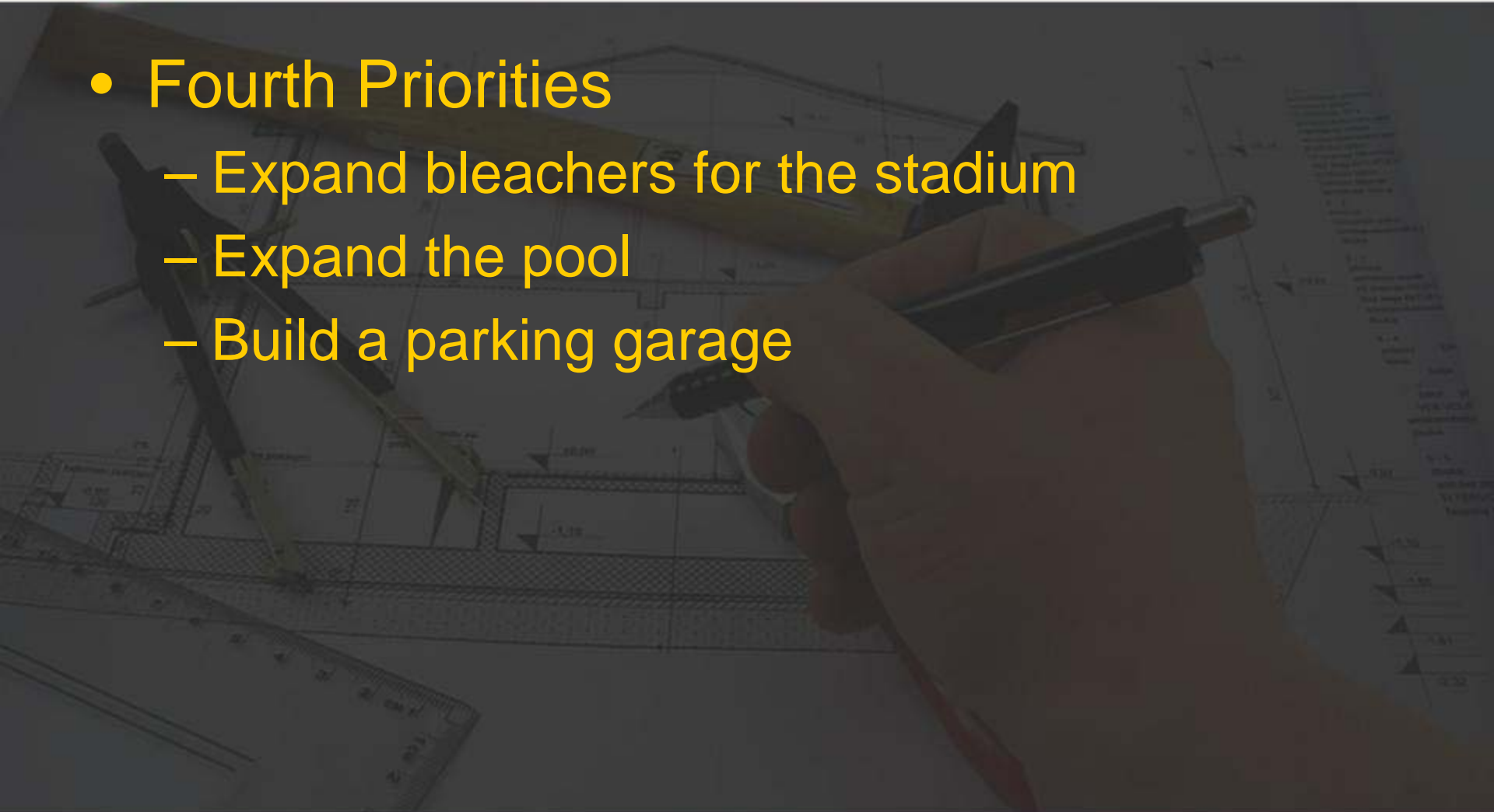
# Priority List

- **Second Priorities**
  - Expand central office
  - Build a mini stadium
  - Increase locker room facilities
  - Build a wrestling room
- **Third Priorities**
  - Build a new auditorium
  - Build a new gymnasium



# Priority List

- Fourth Priorities
  - Expand bleachers for the stadium
  - Expand the pool
  - Build a parking garage





# Options Considered

- By the Hs Expansion Committee
  - Private/Public Partnership
  - High school expansion/academy
  - Middle school expansion/secondary campus
  - Use of time/scheduling
  - Cyber School



# Options Considered

- By the School Board
  - Option A
    - Extensive renovations in existing building
    - North academic addition
    - South athletic/performance annex
  - Option B
    - Extensive renovations
    - South Annex for science, math, gym, & performance center
    - Delay music department renovations



# Options Considered

- Option C
  - Extensive renovations including music department
  - North academic addition
  - South athletic/performance annex is Phase 2
- The School Board chose Option C.
