Reviewing Full Report

The full report provides personalized strategies for each group: Sensory, Environmental and Mindset. Each group provides recommendations and suggestions to help you.

Sensory Preferences: Auditory, Kinesthetic, Tactile, Visual

Environmental Preferences: Intake, Light, Temperature, Mobility, Sound, Setting, Time of Day

Mindset Preferences: Self-Motivation, Teacher Motivation, Independent vs. Collaborative, Task Structure, Task Focus

Sensory Preferences Strategies

You learn with four senses. You may like one or two, but research shows that you benefit most when learning through multiple sensory modes.

Auditory learning refers to what you hear.

- Take notes and re-read them soon after class. For videos, turn on closed captioning.

Kinesthetic learning involves movement and physical activity.

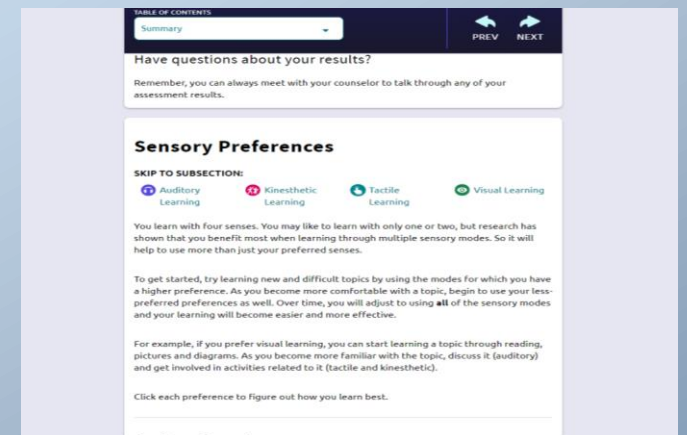
- Ask questions and ask for a handout. Work with another kinesthetic learner.

Tactile learning involves touching and handling objects related to what you are learning.

- Take notes. Highlight key areas. Work with materials.

Visual learning involves seeing what you are learning.

- Take notes in a visual format. Use sketches, diagrams.



Environmental Preferences Strategies

These reflect your environmental preferences. Simply adjust your learning environment, when possible, to suit your strongest preference.

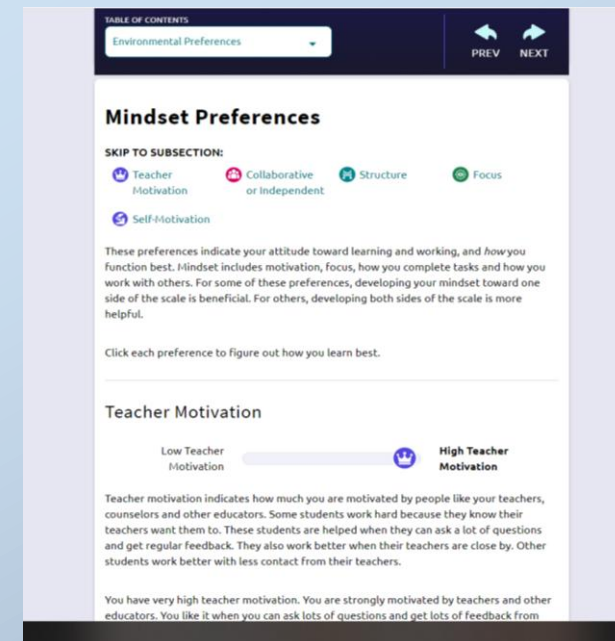
- Prefers bright light
 - Sit by a window
- Working early in the day
 - Complete hardest work early in the day
- Must have quiet
 - Work in a quiet place
 - Use earbuds/headphones
